Teacher handbooks, including follow-up classroom activities, will be provided to guide teachers through each concert.

The winter/spring schedule also includes two special education concerts, featuring the acclaimed jazz-crossover group the **Adam Maness Trio**, and percussive string quartet, **Reignite**!
