SHELDON ART GALLERIES CHILDREN'S EXHIBIT INCLUDES VIBRANT AND PERSONAL DEPICTIONS OF MOZAMBIQUE

ST. LOUIS – The Sheldon Art Galleries presents *Melodies from Mozambique*, November 6, 2020 – January 30, 2021 in the AT&T Gallery of Children's Art. A free public opening will be held **Friday**, **November 6 from 12 - 9 p.m.** Visitor capacity for the opening will be limited to 10 visitors per 15-minute time slot. Advanced registration is required at TheSheldon.org/events/fallopening/. *Registration ends at 10 a.m. on November 6*. Gallery hours are Tuesdays – Fridays, Noon – 5 p.m. and Saturdays, 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. Admission is free. Visitor capacity will be limited to 25% or less of full capacity. Reservations are not required or accepted for regular public hours. All staff and visitors age 9 and older will be required to wear masks while visiting the galleries. The mission team worked with the youth choir from the Malema evangelical station of the United Methodist Church, who produced the photography included in this exhibit. The children's work includes vibrant, colorful and often personal depictions of the landscape, people and everyday life in this beautiful region in northeastern Mozambique. The team was also able to

fund the making of a music video featuring the youth choir, to be shown in the exhibit as well. The prints in the exhibit will be available for sale.
