Dissemination of information is of great interest to artist Tate Foley. He engages with far-reaching formats including newspapers, printed bills, religious tracts and other various printed ephemera as he explores real, tangible, ubiquitous contact rather than idiosyncratic experience. Questions about access to art have been a large focus of his work in recent years. His pieces ask, "how do people access art?," and "what groups have, or do not have, access to the knowledge contained within cultural institutions?" "How do cultural institutions affect (arrest) public education, betterment and experience?"

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Tate Foley has been an associate professor of Art at Webster University since 2010. He received his B.A. in Studio Art from Lycoming College in Williamsport, Pennsylvania and an M.F.A. in printmaking from Lamar Dodd School of Art at the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia. Foley's work has been exhibited in Vienna, Austria; New York City; Washington, D.C.; Cleveland; and St. Louis.

The not-for-profit Sheldon Art Galleries exhibits works by local, national and international artists in all media. Over 6,000 square feet of the galleries' spaces on the 2nd floor are permanently devoted to rotating exhibits of photography, architecture, music art and history, and children's art. A sculpture garden, seen from both the atrium lobby and the connecting glass bridge, features periodic rotations and installations, and the Nancy Spirtas Kranzberg Gallery on the lower level features art of all media. The Sheldon actively supports the work of St. Louis artists in all mediums and features a dedicated gallery with museum-quality exhibits by St. Louis artists, past and present.
