**“SHELDON CLASSICS” SERIES RETURNS WITH CHAMBER PROJECT ST. LOUIS,
PLUS TWO CONCERTS CURATED BY SLSO CONCERTMASTER ERIN SCHREIBER**

ST. LOUIS – The Sheldon Classics series returns March 1 at 8 p.m., available as a three-concert package via subscription, or on a single-ticket basis. The long-running series includes two concerts curated by St. Louis Symphony Concertmaster Erin Schreiber, and the Sheldon series debut of Chamber Project St. Louis. Each concert will also feature the world premiere of new music composed by students from the Mizzou New Music Initiative, a project made possible by the Sinquefield Charitable Foundation.

The series kicks off on **March 1** with a fun-filled, high-energy evening of classical and world music, including works by Chick Corea, Edgar Meyer, Lennon and McCartney, Bach and Gershwin, performed by a dynamic trio composed of three highly acclaimed musicians - pianist Chase Morrin, percussionist Gabriel Globus-Hoenich, and bassist Nathan Farrington. Violinist Erin Schreiber will make a guest appearance.

Chamber Project St. Louis presents *RETOLD: Listening Forward to History*, a re-telling of America through music from the U.S. and Europe, on **April 19**. Known for their innovative concert experiences and inclusive programming, Chamber Project will perform pieces by Cindy McTee, Joseph Haydn, Carlos Simon and Antonin Dvorak.

The series concludes on **May 17** with a multimedia celebration of music and wildlife, led by violinist Erin Schreiber, in collaboration with the Forest Park Living Lab project. The evening will feature photographs, artwork and a video presentation of Forest Park scenes set to music. Selections will include music for violin and piano by Dvorak, Kreisler, Messiaen and Ysaye in this program perfect for music and nature lovers alike!
