**“SHELDON CLASSICS” SERIES WELCOMES CONCERTMASTER DAVID HALEN,
PIANIST ADRIA YE AND CELLIST NATHAN CHAN**

ST. LOUIS – The Sheldon presents David Halen and Friends on The Sheldon Classics series, Wednesday, April 6, 2016 at 8 p.m. in the perfect acoustics of the Sheldon Concert Hall. St. Louis Symphony concertmaster David Halen is joined by pianist Adria Ye, a native of Oregon and a piano competition winner who has played Carnegie Hall, among other top venues, and cellist Nathan Chan, a native of California who has performed with the San Francisco Symphony and the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

Program highlights will include Prokofiev’s Piano Sonata No. 4 and Brahms Piano Trio No. 1 in B Major, Opus 8. Also featured will be the premiere of the commissioned piece “Instruction Manual for Violin and Piano” by University of Missouri-Columbia student José Martinez.

David Halen served as Assistant Concertmaster with the Houston Symphony Orchestra under Sergiu Comissiona and Christoph Eschenbach until 1991. He then came to St. Louis, where he was permanently named Concertmaster of the St. Louis Symphony in September 1995, without audition, and with the endorsement of then Music Directors Leonard Slatkin and Hans Vonk. During the summer, he teaches and performs extensively. As co-founder and artistic director of the Innsbrook Institute, Halen coordinates a weeklong festival in June with exciting musical performances and an enclave for aspiring artists. In August, he acts as artistic director of the Missouri River Festival of the Arts in Boonville, Missouri. His numerous accolades include the 2002 St. Louis Arts and Entertainment Award for Excellence, and honorary doctorates from Central Missouri State University and from the University of Missouri-St. Louis. In 2007 he was appointed Distinguished Visiting Artist at Yale University, and at the new Robert McDuffie Center for Strings at Mercer University in Macon, Georgia. In the fall of 2012, Halen joined the string faculty of the University of Michigan. He plays a 1753 Giovanni Battista Guadagnini violin, made in Milan.
