DAILEY AND VINCENT TO REPLACE MARTY STUART ON SHELDON FOLK SERIES

ST. LOUIS – Due to a scheduling conflict, Marty Stuart and His Fabulous Superlatives will not appear on The Sheldon Folk series on April 20. Replacing the group will be Grammy-winning duo Dailey & Vincent.

Now on Season 3 of their nationally broadcast television series, *The Dailey & Vincent Show* on RFD-TV, Dailey & Vincent bring their music to national audiences on a weekly basis.
