ST. LOUIS, MO – The Sheldon Art Galleries presents a free gallery talk in conjunction with the photography exhibit, *Old*School, New Rules (through April 13, 2019) at the Sheldon Art Galleries. Olivia Lahs-Gonzales, Director of the Sheldon Art Galleries, and artist Barbara McDonnell will speak on selected works in the exhibit.
